Andrew Harvey Brings Passion and Power to Us



A spiritually powerful **Andrew Harvey** returns Sunday, November 1 to Unity of Greater Cleveland to give the Sunday lesson and present a must-attend workshop: “Passion in Action, Sacred Practices for a Dangerous World.” The workshop begins at 1:00 p.m. The suggested love offering is \$40.00.

Says Andrew, “I believe that everyone has a direct connection to the Divine, and finding this direct connection is the clue to the kind of radical self empowerment that can help you become a passionate and peaceful and brave sacred activist.”

He will share his vision of the four kinds of practices that he believes are essential for the transformation our times are calling for. Cool practices can help us connect with Divine Being and its great peace. Hot practices help us fuse with the heart of the Divine. Prayer practices enable us to keep constantly aligned with the beloved, and sacred body practices open the whole body to the subtle images of divine love.

Andrew’s Sunday lesson title is: “Finding your mission, Sacred Activism and World Crisis.”

Andrew Harvey was born in south India in 1952 where he lived until he was nine years old. It is this early period that he credits with shaping his sense of the inner unity of all religions and providing him with a permanent and inspiring vision of a world infused with the sacred. He left India to attend private school in England and entered Oxford University in 1970 with a scholarship to study history. At the age of 21, he became the youngest person ever to be awarded a fellowship to All Soul’s College, England’s highest academic honor.

By 1977 Andrew Harvey had become disillusioned with life at Oxford and returned to his native India, where a series of mystical experiences initiated his spiritual journey. Over the next thirty years he plunged into different mystical traditions to learn their secrets and practices. In 1978 after he began his long study and practice of Hinduism, he met a succession of Indian saints and sages. Later explorations immersed him in Sufi mysticism and helped him synthesize the whole of his mystical explorations and reconcile eastern with western mysticism.

He is the author and co-author of several books, including *The Tibetan Book of Living and Dying*. His most recent work is *The Pope, a Guide to Sacred Activism*.
